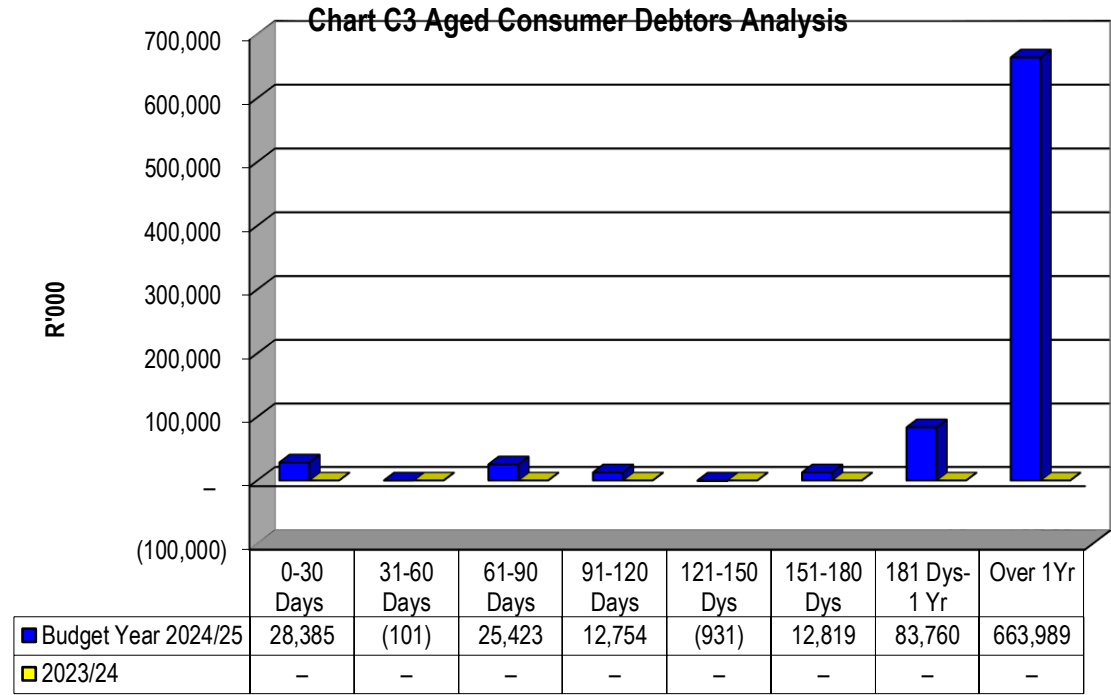
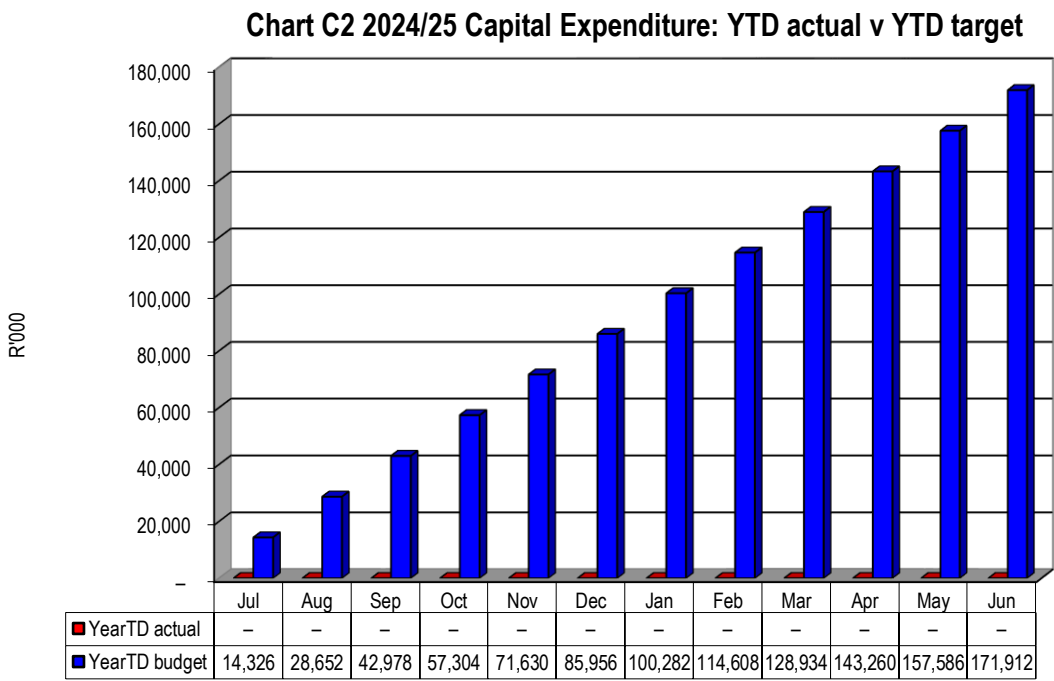
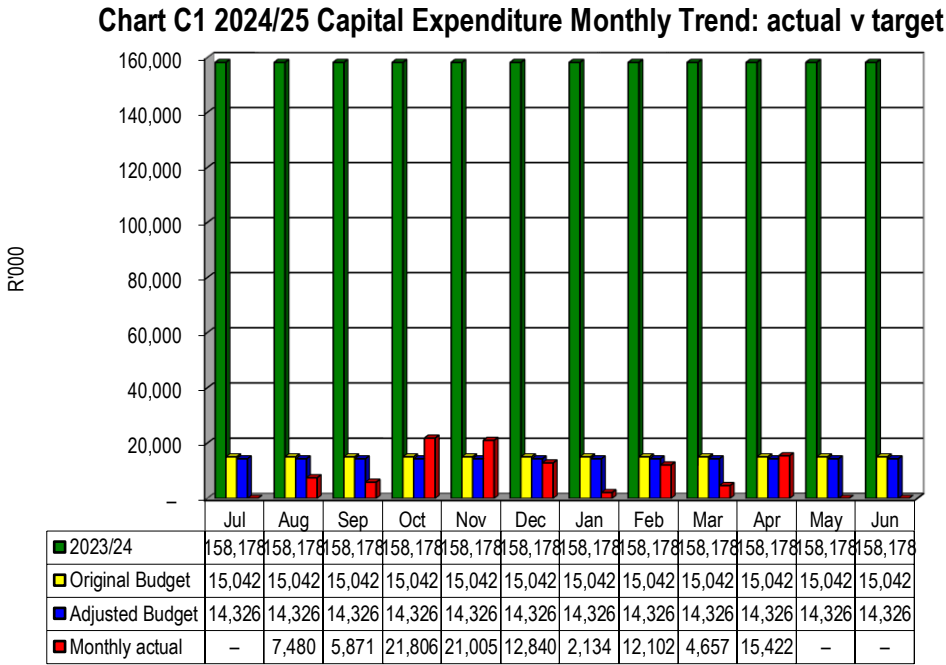


Chart C4 Consumer Debtors (total by Debtor Customer Category)

Chart C4 Consumer Debtors (total by Debtor Customer Category)

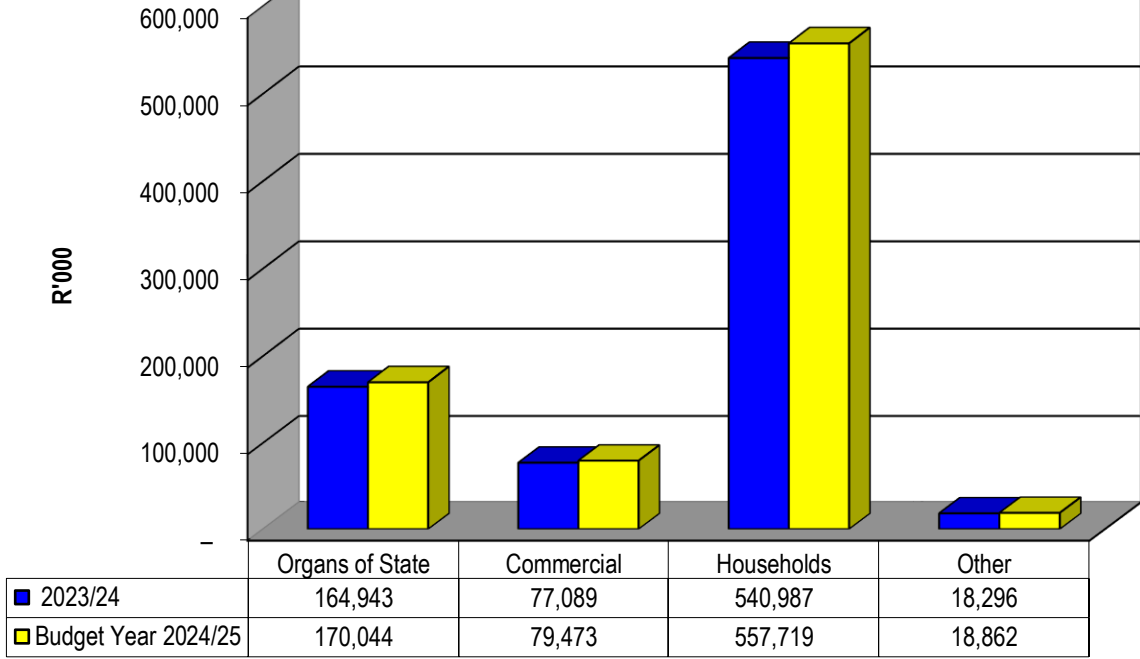
